Commonwealth Transportation Board Visits with NRV Partners

Dr. Raymond Smoot, Salem District Commonwealth Transportation Board Representative stopped by to visit with local partners to discuss transportation priorities on December 12, 2023. The meetings provided those seeking competitive funding programs an opportunity to share local projects. In addition, everyone had a chance to learn about important changes in grant application scoring criteria. The Regional Commission has coordinated local meetings for more than 15 years and will offer another opportunity in the Fall of 2024.

The Virginia Department of Transportation offers competitive transportation opportunities statewide on two-year funding cycles. This year, communities had an opportunity to submit projects under Revenue Sharing, Transportation Alternatives, and the Highway Safety Improvement Program. Next year, communities will prepare for the next round of SMART Scale. For more information about competitive

New River Valley Passenger Rail **Station Authority**

The New River Valley Passenger Rail Station Authority met in mid-December to select officers for the coming year. The officers for 2024 include Chair, Mayor Mike Barber, Christiansburg; Vice-Chair Angie Hill, Montgomery County; Secretary, Lynsay Belshe, Virginia Tech; Treasurer, Dirk Compton, Pulaski County.

On January 25th, the Authority will hold a joint meeting with NRV Passenger Rail to receive a report from the Virginia Passenger Rail Authority on 30% design drawings for the New River Valley extension project. The 30% design will include

Live, Work, Eat, Grow (LWEG), a local nonprofit that operates Millstone Kitchen in the Old Prices Fork School and manages a robust community garden program, celebrated its fifth year as an organization in 2023. LWEG's partnership with the Town of Blacksburg to create and manage three community gardens spurred an award submission to the Virginia Municipal League (VML), and the Town won two honors from VML: the Innovation Award for Community Health and the President's Award. LWEG now employs three staff members and has a Board of 12, many of whom participated in the redevelopment of the Old Prices Fork Elementary School dating back to 2015.
