Regional Commission Annual Award Recipients

On October 23rd, the New River Valley Regional Commission board of directors, comprised of elected officials and citizen appointees across the region, hosted a dinner event at The Highlander Hotel in Radford, VA to honor the 2025 award

recipients. Approximately 100 local government elected officials, state and federal representatives, and local government planning commission chairs were in attendance.

Ms. Angie Covey, New River Community College, was the recipient of the Citizen of the Valley award. This award is given to a citizen within the New River Valley who has made significant contributions to the betterment of the region. Ms. Covey was recognized for her role in helping to establish the Access to Community College Education (ACCE) program that provides two years of tuition at New River Community

College at no cost to high school graduates in the region. Since 2015, the program has grown to serve over 500 students each year.

Judge Lee Harrell, 27th Judicial Circuit of Virginia, was the recipient of the Champion of the Valley award. This award is given to an appointed or elected official within, or representing, the New River Valley who has greatly assisted communities and residents during their service to the public. Through his leadership in the development and implementation of the Recovery Court program, he has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to justice, rehabilitation, and community transformation. The Recovery Court program has become a beacon of hope for individuals trapped in the cycle of addiction and criminal behavior. Rather than being treated solely as offenders, participants in Recovery Court are seen as individuals—people with potential, with stories, and with the capacity to recover and thrive.

Dr. Tamarah Holmes, Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, was the recipient of the Friend of the Valley award. This award is given to an individual or organization outside the New River Valley who has made significant contributions to the betterment of the region. Dr. Holmes serves as the Director of the Virginia Office of Broadband and State Program Manager for the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC). In these roles, she has overseen approximately 25,000 houses and businesses receiving broadband service in the region, and several million dollars of ARC investment for transformative projects such as the Old Prices Fork School Redevelopment, industrial park expansions, New River Water Trail Extension, and planning for the reintroduction of passenger rail service to the New River Valley.

Each award recipient was provided a custom stained-glass piece of art by the local artist Sandy Davenport, a member of 'Round the Mountain, Southwest Virginia's Artisan Network.

Radford University's Angela Joyner, Ph.D., Vice President for Economic **Development and Corporate** Education, and Nichole Hair, Director of Economic Development and Community Engagement, led a tour of The HUB, which serves as a gathering place for small businesses and individuals to work, learn, and grow. The HUB offers workspaces, amenities, and business support in a prime location in downtown Radford.



Claremont Apartment Project

The Claremont Apartments project, located in the Town of Pulaski, was one of the inaugural recipients of \$850,000 in NRV Housing Fund investment. This project is redeveloping the former Claremont Elementary School into apartments and constructing new units on the same parcel, for a total of 50 new rental units. All units will serve households earning below 80% of

Although not yet constructed, the tour and overview of a future amphitheater site offered a glimpse into plans for an outdoor multi-use venue situated beautifully on the New River.

A highlight of the workshop was the guided tour of the Artis Center for the Visual and Performing Arts, presented by Dean Rachel Williams. Attendees explored state-of-the-art theaters, studios, and exhibition spaces, including a bird's-eye view of the Main Stage Theater from the catwalk.

ReNew the New

On September 6th, 2025 multiple groups of volunteers gathered in Giles County, Montgomery County and the City of Radford to participate in the annual ReNew the New Fall Cleanup. Working from both the shoreline and within boats on the river, over 421 volunteers led by devoted community members, business owners and local government staff were able to remove a great deal of tires and debris that had made its way into the New River. So far reported, this year's event removed 160 bags of debris, (1,340 pounds) and over 92 tires from the water!
