## Bridging the Digital Divide: Groundbreaking Ceremony Marks Major Broadband Expansion in Giles County

In a landmark moment for regional connectivity, the Regional Commission proudly joined Giles County community leaders, Pembroke Telephone



Cooperative (PemTel), and both state and local officials to break ground on a transformative broadband infrastructure project in Giles County.

The groundbreaking ceremony, held on May 29, 2025, marked the official start of construction on a fiber-to-the-home network that will bring high-speed internet access to over 600 unserved and underserved households and businesses in the White Gate, Staffordsville, Poplar Hill, Sugar Run, Wilburn Valley and Walker Creek Communities. This initiative is part of a broader effort to close the digital divide in rural Virginia, ensuring that residents have the tools they need to thrive in an increasingly connected world. This project is not just about laying fiber in the ground, it's about connecting people to opportunity and laying the foundation for economic development, education, and telehealth services that are essential to rural communities.

Construction is expected to start in June with a completion date set for fall of 2026. The Regional Commission is proud to play a part in bringing next-generation connectivity to Giles County and strengthening the region's digital future.

#### Floyd County Housing Development

Floyd County recently celebrated the completion of a \$1M grant from the VA Department of Housing and Community Development. The grant assisted 14 households across the county with housing rehabilitation. The project also leveraged over \$220,000 in other funding sources to supplement project needs around well/septic repair, weatherization and

energy efficiency needs, junk removal, handicap accessibility modifications, planting of native shrubs and bushes, and other construction funding gaps. A highly collaborative project, the project was supported by Habitat for Humanity of the New River Valley, FISH, SERCAP, the New River Valley Regional Commission, Community Housing Partners, SustainFloyd, Renovation Alliance, and the Floyd-Floyd County Public Service Authority.

Due to the success of the project and overwhelming local demand, the County applied for and was recently awarded a second round of grant funding to continue this important work. The project team and recipients of housing rehab work gathered in June to celebrate the successful completion of this first phase.

# GO TEC Launch in the New River Valley

On June 10th, the GO Virginia State Board announced its approval for the Region 2 project, "GO TEC Launch in the New River Valley and Roanoke County". This project, led by Montgomery County Public Schools, will bring the GO TEC initiative to five



school districts in Montgomery County, the City of Radford, Giles County, Pulaski County, and Roanoke County.

This initiative will impact over 1,100 middle school students by introducing them to high-wage, high-skill careers in engineering and technology, strengthening the regional skilled workforce.

# NRV Recovery Ecosystem Awarded \$3.35 Million for Third Year of Opioid Abatement Funding

The Regional Commission supported the NRV Recovery Ecosystem in submitting its third-year renewal proposal to the Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority (OAA) in April. On June 5, the OAA Grants Committee announced its FY26 funding awards—and we are excited to share that

the NRV Recovery Ecosystem was awarded \$3.35 million in competitive grant funding. An additional ~\$410,000 in local matching funds was committed by Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, and Pulaski Counties, as well as the City of Radford.

This new round of funding will build on the momentum of the first two years, supporting a comprehensive range of initiatives focused on treatment, supportive housing, education and workforce training, transportation, evidence-based harm reduction, Recovery Court, peer-led services, and a regional anti-stigma campaign.

Highlights from the first two years include:

- Expanded harm reduction services across the region
- Extended hours for on-demand transportation
- Growth of Recovery Court programming
- · Launch of peer-led support services
- Implementation of youth prevention programs in local schools
- · Opening of new recovery and prevention centers in Giles and Pulaski Counties

As we enter this third year, local governments and service partners remain committed to deepening collaboration, expanding access to care, and building a lasting and sustainable ecosystem of recovery throughout the New River Valley.
